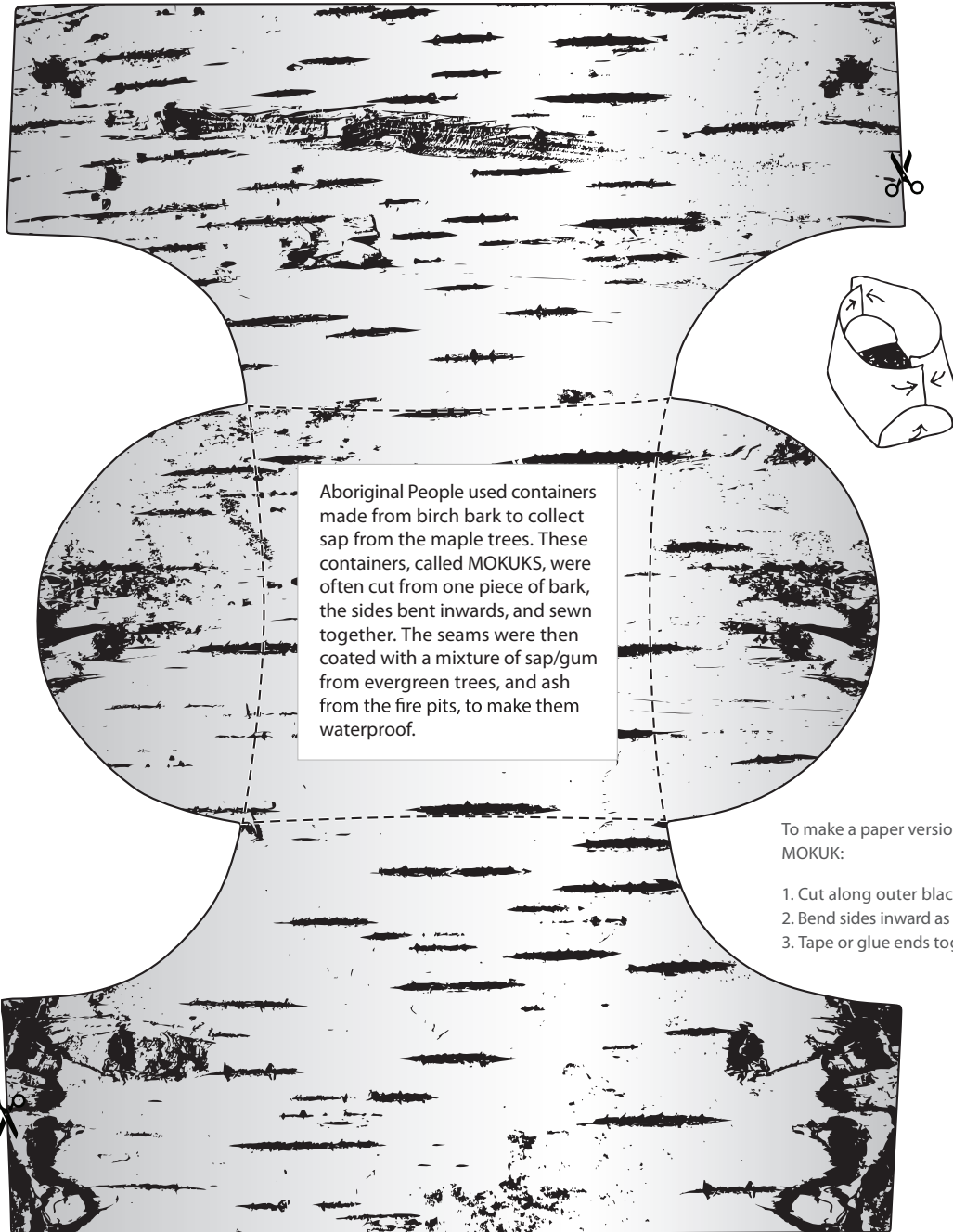


BIRCH BARK MOKUKS

Native Americans would make and use Mokuks to collect Maple Sap and use as storage. When Early Settlers came, they brought metal buckets and pots. This would help make the collection and boiling of sap an easier process.

This activity gives an idea of what Mokuks look like, and how to make your own!

What are some things you would use a Mokuk at home for?



To make a paper version of a MOKUK:

1. Cut along outer black line.
2. Bend sides inward as shown.
3. Tape or glue ends together.
